NED GRAHAM

Ned Graham is a graduate of Western Illinois University. He coached 8 years of varsity baseball at Cuba, Illinois. He is presently teaching math and coaching varsity baseball at Lewistown Community High School, his alma mater. In his 10 years as head coach at Lewistown, he has a 247-62-1 record with 8 consecutive Prairieland Conference championships, 4 Regional championships, 4 Sectional championships, 4 State Tournament appearances which included a 3rd place in 1990, 1st place in 1993 and 2nd place in 1994. During his 18 year career, he has won a total of 288 games.

Ned is a member of the greater Peoria Baseball Coaches Association, the Illinois High School Baseball Coaches Association, and the National High School Baseball Coaches Association. He coached the East squad in the 1993 Illinois Coaches High School All-Star game in

Peoria. He helped coach the West squad in the 1994 I.C.A. All-Star game. He has helped coach the Greater Peoria Baseball Association All-Star games the last five years. He is currently the Class "A" All-State Chairman and a conference rep for the western area. He was selected as the Western Area Coach of the Year in 1989, 1991, 1993, and 1994. He was "Class A" Coach of the Year in 1993. He was also named the winner of the Illinois 1993 Golden Diamond Volunteer Amateur Baseball Coach of the Year award. Ned has coached numerous all-conference and all-western area players. He has also had 4 all-state players. Ned lives is Lewistown with his wife, Michelle, son, Scott, and daughter, Kadi. Scott played for his dad on the state champion and runner-up teams.

DAVE LINDLEY

Dave Lindley began his high school coaching career when he was reunited with his former high school mentor, Ken McGonagle. He joined Ken's coaching staff at Evanston Township High School in 1974.

In June of 1978, Dave was named Hinsdale South High School's head coach and held that position through the 1994 season. During his 16 year tenure as head coach, his teams won 286 games as well as four conference titles (1979, 1981, 1982, 1987) and five regional titles (1979, 1981, 1982, 1989, 1990). Dave's Hinsdale South Hornets also appeared in three sectional finals. The 1982 squad captured the Class AA State Championship. That same year, Lindley was named IHSBCA Coach of the Year. During summer league competition, his squads won 2 conference titles and one regional championship.



Dave continues his association with the Hinsdale South Baseball Program as the Head Sophomore Coach. A graduate of Illinois Wesleyan University, Dave was a four year starter at catcher. He received his master's degree from Northwestern University. Lindley is a native of Evanston, Illinois. He and his wife, Carolyn, have a son, Ryan, and reside in Glenview.

BOB MACKEY

Bob will enter his 20th year as head varsity baseball coach at Stevenson High School. He has won 393 games to date including five conference championships ('83, '86, '88, '89, '94) and regional championships in 1987 and 1993. During Bob's tenure, Stevenson High School has appeared in the Summer State Finals 4 times capping it with a state championship in 1995. Stevenson has had 11 consecutive 20+ win seasons (1986-1996). Bob was the summer Coach of the Year in 1995. He has had 54 players go on to play college baseball. Bob has also served on the ABCA National Clinic Committee for the conventions of '94, '95 and '96. Bob is a graduate of Barrington High School. He received his B.S. from Southern Illinois University and his M. S. from Northern Illinois University.

Bob and his wife Kim have two daughters, Shannon and Lauren.

JIM SCHMID

Jim will be entering his 20th season as a head coach this year. Jim has amassed 417 victories as head coach at the high school and college level. He served as head coach at Aurora Central Catholic from 1978-82, at Aurora University from 1983-92 and has been head coach at Waubonsie Valley High School since 1993. Jim's team at Aurora Central was the Class A State runner up in 1981. Last season at Waubonsie Valley he again made it to the title game finishing second in the Class AA tournament. At the NCAA Division III level, Aurora University was National runner up in 1990 and made a second world series appearance in 1992.

Jim has 6 Regional championships, 2 at the college level and 4 at the high school level, 2 sectional championships and 12 conference championships. Jim has numerous Coach of the Year honors including the Beacon News (1981 and 1996) Northern Illinois Intercollegiate Conference 1992, Mideast Region 1996, Central Region 1992 and the Pitch and Hit Club in 1990. Jim has served on the IHSBCA Executive Board as

Publicity Chairman. Jim has also been inducted into the Aurora Central Catholic High School Hall of Fame. Jim and his wife Cathy have two children, Chris and Matthew.



BILL SEIPLE

Bill graduated from Naperville Central in 1971. He played for IHSBCA Hall of Famer Dick Smith and Dale Shymkewich and was an Upstate Eight all conference infielder as a senior. He attended Monmouth College graduating in 1975 and was an all Midwest Conference selection his senior year. Bill worked as an assistant to Paul Ryan at Naperville North from 1976-82 where, with Phil Lawler, the three initiated the baseball program at Naperville North High School.

His varsity record at Naperville Central is 330-125 and include the following: 7 IHSA Regional Championships ('82, '86, '87, '88, '92, '93, '94). Naperville Central won the DuPage Valley Conference 5 times capped by the 1992 squad that became the only conference team ever to go undefeated with a 21-0 conference record. Bill's summer league teams have been in 8 Summer Championship tournaments fin-

ishing 2nd in '84, '91 and '93 and winning the Summer State Tournament in 1989.

Bill served the IHSBCA as the Summer League Director from 1984-1989. He was on the IHSBCA Board of Directors for 9 years including 2 as president. Seiple received the Les Miller Man of the Year in 1987. Bill also has served on the Chicago Sun Times All Area Committee for the past several years. He served the National High School Coaches Association as the District 4 All America Chair for three years. He is presently the All State Chairman for the IHSBCA.

Bill is married (Nancy) with two children (Ryan and Ashley). He is presently a Dean of Students at Naperville Central High School.

LARRY SMITH

Larry will be entering his 32nd season as the head coach at Kaskaski College. larry's squads have 6 conference championships, six sectional championships and one regional XXIV State tourney championship, and finished second in the Great Lakes District Tourney in 1991. He has compiled 774 victories during those years at a school which limits recruiting to 2/3 in district and 1/3 out of district and no out of state recruiting. Kaskaskia is in a district that has a total high school enrollment of 3000 students. Larry has also served the Kansas City Royals and St. Louis Cardinals as an associate and recommending scout for 14 years. Larry served as the head coach of the South Jr. College All-Star teams in 1982 and 1994. He served as chairman of the State of Illinois Junior College Baseball committee in '82. '83, '91, '92, '93 and '94. Larry coached the North Team at the 1986 Olympic Festival in Houston, Texas winning a bronze medal. Larry has coached 9


