

TED DAMOS — Waukegan High School, Waukegan

Ted attended Waukegan High School and the University of Wisconsin. He returned to Waukegan to coach the Bulldogs in the tough Suburban League from 1945 to 1961.

Ted led Waukegan to six District, six Regional, and six Sectional championships. His 1960 team finished second in the State Tournament. Ted's Waukegan Bulldogs still share the record for most consecutive appearances in state tournament play. He is a member of the Illinois High School Tournament Baseball Hall of Fame.

In 1961 Ted gave up his head coaching duties in the Waukegan School system to assume responsibilities as physical education department chairman for both Waukegan East and West campuses. In 1974 he retired to become a gentleman farmer in central Illinois which affords him the opportunity to attend most state tournaments and to renew old acquaintenances.



HARRY ELBE — Camp Point Central High School, Camp Point

Harry began his coaching career at Mt. Carmel. After a six year stint he moved on to Camp Point Central where he has been coaching for the past 14 years. During this 20 year period, Harry has amassed 291 wins and only 54 losses for a winning percentage of 85. His teams have won 12 conference championships, six District and three Regional titles. He has twice taken Camp Point Central, enrollment 400, to the State Tournament. Two former players, Paul and Rick Reuschel, have become major league standouts.

Harry has been very active in state high school baseball organizations. He serves as the West Central Conference representative for the Illinois Baseball Coaches' selection committee. He was one of four to share coaching responsibilities for the West All-Star team in the summer of 1979.



TY FRANKLIN — Richwoods High School, Peoria

Ty is the grand daddy of active high school baseball coaches in the central Illinois area. After having coached Ogden Community High for two years and Potomac for six, he has been coaching at Peoria Richwoods for the past 24 years. Over this period of time Ty has won eight Mid-State 10 Conference titles, 10 District, two Regional and one Sectional Championship. His 1978 team placed second in the State Tournament. His teams have played 673 games and have been victorious 385 times. Ty has fielded teams for five consecutive years which have won 20 or more games.

Ty Franklin is noted for other accomplishments in the field of Illinois athletics. In 1978 he was voted by his peers as Athletic Director of the Year for the State of Illinois.



RON KLEIN - New Trier East High School, Winnetka

Ron's first and only high school coaching job has been at New Trier East. He has accumulated 266 victories over a 19 year period playing in the tough Suburban League and in the Central Suburban League. He has won four conference titles and has finished first or second in each of the past nine years. His teams have won four District and three Regional titles. Last year his team participated in the State Tournament. Two former players, John Castino and Ross Baumgarten, are current standouts in the American League.

Ron has contributed to Illinois high school baseball in many, many ways. He is Past President of the IHSBCA and presently serves on its board of directors, All-State and District four chairman of the high school division of the AACBC, chairman of the District Four Coach of the Year committee, a member of the Suburban Tribune All-Area selection committee, and associate scout for the Kansas City Royals, and past secretary of the Pitch and Hit Club of Chicago. He was selected the AACBC District four and National High School Coach of the year in 1977 and the IHSBCA Man of the Year in 1978.



DON KUEHNER - Marist High School, Chicago

Don began his head coaching career in 1963 at Valley High School in Iowa. After five very successful years, he moved to Marist High School.

Don's teams have won a total of 318 games for a winning percentage of 70%. His teams have won six conference championships, six District, five Regional and one Sectional title. His 1978 team won an amazing 38 games climaxing the season by winning the State championship.

Don has been selected the Southwest Suburban Coach of the Year four times. He was selected the AACBC's high school Coach of the Year for Illinois and for District Four in 1978. He has been very active on various baseball committees in the state and presently serves as a Vice-President of the Illinois High School Baseball Coaches Association.



ROGER KRATOCHVIL - Mt. Olive High School, Mt. Olive

Roger is a graduate of Eastern Illinois University where he earned four letters in baseball, was most valuable player his senior year and set a school RBI record which stood for 20 years.

Roger has been at Mt. Olive for his entire 20 year head coaching career. During this period, the small central Illinois school of 240 students has won 62 percent of its games while taking on schools the likes of Springfield Griffin and Collinsville. Mt. Olive has won four District and two Regional championships and one South Central Conference title. In 1978 two players were selected from this school to represent the west in the All-Star game in Peoria.

Roger is a member of the AACBC, the Illinois Coaches Association and the IHSBCA, serving in many leadership capacities. Also, he serves as a member of the St. Louis Cardinal pre-draft and open camp staff. For you CB buffs, Roger carries the handle, "Mr. Baseball".



DR. JIM SCOTT - University High School, Normal

Jim has served as head coach at University High for the past 23 years. The class "A" school has competed in the tough Corn Belt conference where 80% of the schedule has been against class "AA" competition.

Teams coached by Jim have won six conference titles. His teams have also won eight District, five Regional and three Sectional championships. His 1979 team placed second in the State Class "A" tournament. His 1980 team also reached the State tournament.

Jim has been an active participant in state baseball organizations. He serves as Area Chairman for the Illinois High School Baseball Coaches Association and has for several years served as District Chairman for the Illinois Coaches Association.



JIM SMILGOFF - Taft High School, Chicago

Jim is one of the truly great legends of Chicago high school sthletics where he coached first at Harrison High School for seven years and then for 13 years at Taft High School.

Jim coached his teams to 398 victories against only 78 losses. In his 20 years in Chicago high school baseball, his teams won 18 sectional championships and five All-Chicago titles. His teams never finished below second.

Jim was a coach for the Chicagoland High School All-Stars when that game was a fixture at White Sox Park. Also, he served as coach for United States High School All-Star team that played in the Polo Grounds in New York.

Jim was a scout for the Chicago Cubs and directed the Cubs' summer baseball training camp for a 12 year period. He is the author of two books on baseball and is listed in Who's Who in American Education. Jim retired in 1973.
