

JACK HORENBERGER - Illinois Wesleyan, Bloomington

Jack started his baseball coaching career with four years at Wilmington High School and then went on to Illinois Wesleyan where he was baseball coach for 37 years. During this latter 37 year period while taking on colleges and universities from all divisions, Jack's teams amassed 509 victories. His conference record was an amazing 319 and 98, good for 16 conference championships.

Some of the special honors bestowed upon Jack by his peers include three NAIA — District Coach of the Year, NAIA Helms Foundation Hall of Fame and AACBC Meritorious awards. Also, he served for 16 years as the commissioner for the Central Illinois Collegiate summer baseball league. Two former players, Bobby Winkles - Oakland A's and California Angels, and Doug Rader - Houston Astros, have gone on to manage major league baseball teams. In last year's IHSA AA baseball championship game, both teams were coached by Illinois Wesleyan graduates, Dave Lindley and Robin Cooper.

Jack Horenberger is now retired and living in Bloomington.



LYLE MORROW - Wheaton Central High School, Wheaton

Lyle has been the varsity baseball coach at Wheaton Central for the past 20 years. During this time, his teams have won six District, one Regional and two conference Championships accumulating 242 wins. His summer high school teams have been even more successful once reaching the finals of the summer tournament. He was selected Coach of the Year for 1981 by the DuPage Press.

Coach Morrow has been extremely active in promoting baseball in the suburban area. He has served his community as clinician for the Wheaton Boys Baseball organization. Also, Lyle has served area coaches as a representative on the Suburban Trib baseball panel. He is an active member of the IHSBCA, the AACBC and the Illinois Coaches Association.



LEE SCHULTE - Marissa Jr.-Sr. HIgh School, Marissa

Lee has been coaching at Marissa High School for 18 years. During this time Lee's teams have won 11 conference titles and have accumulated 311 wins. His teams have won five District, three Regionals and two Sectional championships. His baseball teams traveled to the state tournament in 1972 and 1980. Sandwiched between these two teams Lee coached the Marissa basketball team to the state tournament in 1977.

Coach Schulte, with community help, built an outstanding high school baseball facility. He then went on a six month crusade in which he raised \$20,000 to light the field. In appreciation, in 1980 Marissa Unit District 40 dedicated and named the high school baseball field "Schulte Field".



DICK SMITH - Naperville Central High School, Naperville

Retired baseball coach Dick Smith served as head coach at Naperville Central for 26 years, winning 289 games. His teams won seven Little Seven and three Upstate Eight conference titles. Also, his summer high school teams won 3 Far West League championships. In IHSA tournament play Naperville Central won nine District and three Regional championships under his guidance. His 1969 team was a semifinalist in the state tournament.

Dick Smith was a founding father of the Naperville Little League and Pony League and for many years conducted baseball clinics for coaches. He was the Naperville Sun Coach of the Year for 1981.

Dick Smith is retired from baseball coaching but continues to teach at Naperville Central.



JOHN K. STAATS - Springfield High School, Springfield

John has spent his entire 20 year career has a head coach at Springfield High School. He has won seven Big 12 conference championships, eight city titles, has had 14 winning seasons, and has amassed 285 wins. At one time he won five District championships in a row while accumulating a total of seven. John's teams have won six Regionals and one Sectional championship. He was selected the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 1975.

John is well known at all levels of baseball in Springfield for the outstanding clinics which he has presented to both athletes and coaches.



JAMES L. (JACK) STEPHENS - Streator High School, Streator

Jack coached at Anna-Jonesboro Community High School for two years and then for 21 years at Streator Township High School. He won five Illinois Valley Conference titles and 251 games during his coaching career. His teams won 11 District, seven Regional, and three Sectional championships. He took teams to the State tournament in 1954, 1955, 1963. Twenty of Jack's 23 years of coaching were winning

Jack was an active leader in baseball circles until his baseball retirement in 1979. He continues to teach at Streator High School.
